The HASL sponsored programs for the Spring Conference and Reading Fair, April 19 - 21, appeal to various interests of school librarians. The first event is the dinner on Friday night with AIA President Jean Lowrie, a former school librarian and AASL President, as main speaker.

Saturday morning's HASL business meeting conducted by President Toyo Nakamura will feature voting on by-laws revision and installation of new officers. Later in separate sessions there will be a demonstration by Dave Thorne of simple displays and graphics, and a report on the activities of the Task Force on Sex Bias in Education in Hawaii by Suzanne Case, Librarian at Hanalei School.

The buffet luncheon promises to be a real treat. The guest speaker will be satirist, Richard Armour, who is the author of 50 books, the latest of which is Sea Full of Whales, a children's book written with the assistance of whale specialists at Hawaii's own Sea Life Park.

Also of special interest to our members is Virginia Haviland's presentation, "Library of Congress and Children's Publications", which is sponsored by the HLA Children's Section. All persons who do library work with children are urged to attend.

Films will be shown both Friday and Saturday. We are hoping to have winners of the PACT Statewide Super 8 Film Festival for students. Exhibitions will be open all three days, so please visit them. A wide variety of books, media, equipment and services will be displayed.

We hope to see a big turn out of our HASL members.

VIRGINIA HAYLAND WORKSHOP (FRIDAY)

Ms. Virginia Hayland, author and Head of the Children's Book Section of the Library of Congress, will be in Hawaii for the Spring Conference, April 19-20. Friends of the Library of Hawaii are sponsoring her visit.

On Friday, April 19, she will be guest at a workshop for children's librarians to be held at the Alo Moana Hotel from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. The program will open with a talk by Ms. Hayland on her work reviewing new children's books (mostly for Hornbook Magazine) and editing books for children.

This will be followed by a presentation by Ms. Hubellite Johnson, member of the University of Hawaii faculty, on Hawaiian folklore. After lunch Ms. Hayland will discuss international awards, organizations and programs which deal with children's books. She is loaning us some books as examples of work by outstanding foreign authors and illustrators.

Ms. Hayland will speak at the Children's Section meeting on Saturday morning, April 20. She will describe her work editing and compiling folklore and her work at the Library of Congress.

Anyone interested in attending the workshop is welcome to come. See if your Principal will let you attend.
