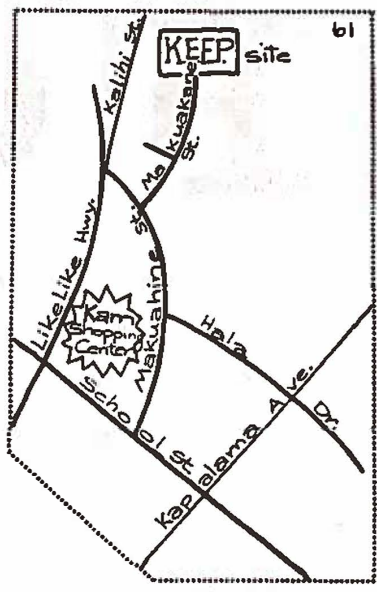

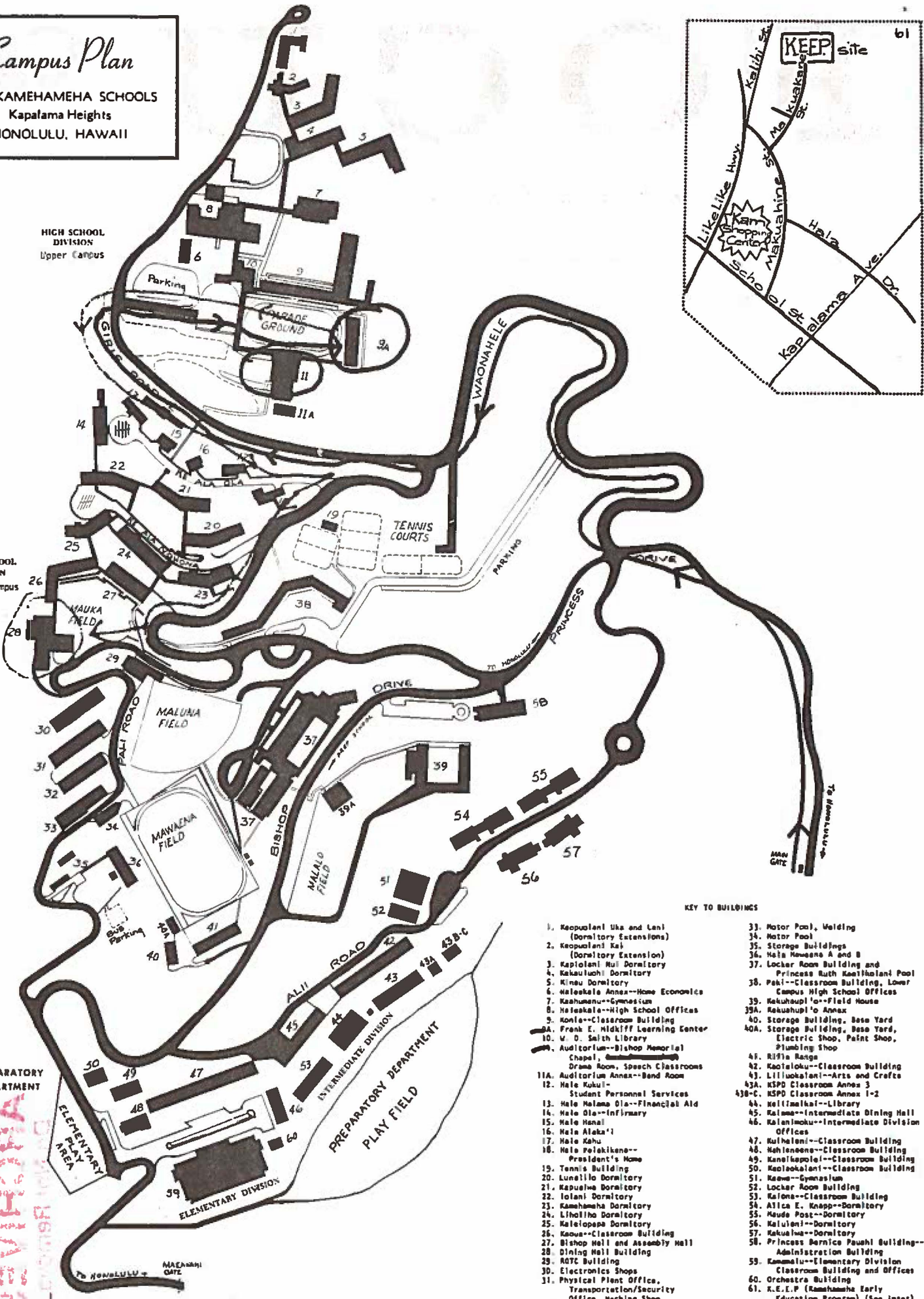

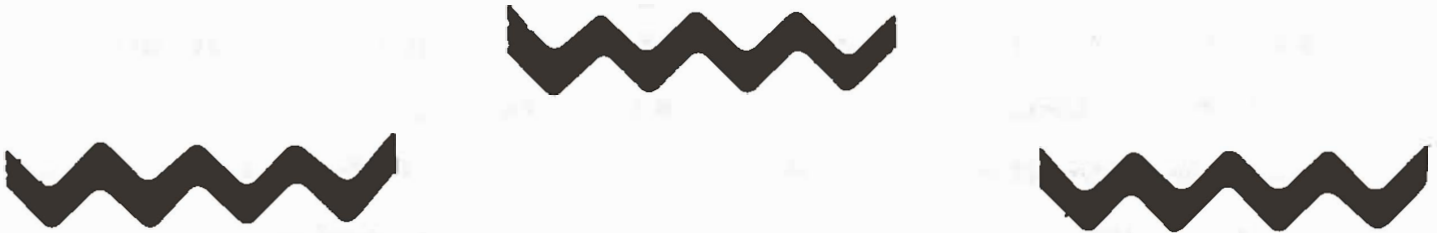

SECOND GOVERNOR'S CONFERENCE ON LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SERVICES

Public hearings have already taken place to provide citizen in-put and direction for the Second Governor's Conference on Library and Information Services June 12-13, 1978 at the Ilikai Hotel. Rev. David Kaupu, Chairman of the Planning Committee, conducted the hearings on all islands. They were fruitful to say the least, covering citizen concerns on staff, funding and resources of libraries throughout the State.

The 1978 Conference will address itself to major needs of residents and explore ways they can be met. It will focus public attention on the current status of libraries in Hawaii and set goals for development. Results of the Conference provide steam for the September 1979 White House Conference. The theme of both conferences is "Towards a networking of libraries" - aimed at sharing library resources between and among all types of libraries.

Delegates will be two-thirds citizens and one-third librarians. Included will be representatives and key people in business, industry, government, education, labor, civic and citizen action groups, as well as the library profession which will provide facts and figures and listen and learn from users. The selection process has not yet been determined but will include representation from all islands.

Funding for the June, 1978 conference will come from the National Commission on Libraries and Information Science; Library Services and Construction Act, Hawaii Library Association, Friends of the Library of Hawaii and other organizations.

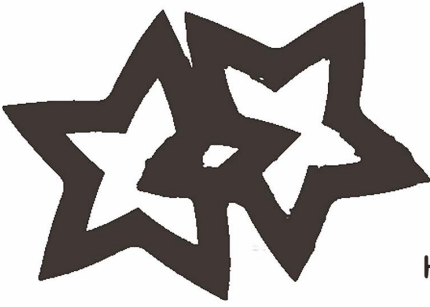
